




## Important Information About the Following Data:

- Each charter is evaluated within the [IPCSC framework](#).
- For academic data, some schools are included in more than one analysis. This means the data pool for certain measures may be larger than 59 programs, while others may be smaller, depending on grade levels and program types.
  - For example, traditional charter schools are typically evaluated under one academic program, while charter schools that operate an alternative program within their charter are evaluated under two academic programs.
  - Schools that do not serve grades K–3 do not have *Literacy Proficiency* data, and schools without a high school program are not measured on *College and Career Readiness*.
- Similar nuances apply to Operations and Financial data.
- The data pool used for each measure is identified at the beginning of each section.
























## FY 25 Financial Health Overview | Current Ratio






## FY 25 Financial Health Overview | Debt Service Coverage Ratio


## FY 25 Financial Health Overview | Debt-to-Asset Ratio




## Portfolio Academic Performance Trends Summary (FY24–FY25)

Overall, the FY25 data show meaningful improvement across most academic indicators, particularly in proficiency measures, with fewer schools in the *Does Not Meet* category and a larger share meeting or exceeding expectations.

### **Math Proficiency**

Math proficiency shows one of the strongest year-over-year gains. The percentage of schools rated *Does Not Meet* declined substantially from FY24 to FY25, while the share rated *Meets* increased notably. The proportion rated *Exceeds* remained relatively stable. This shift suggests that many schools moved out of the lowest performance band and into meeting grade-level expectations.

### **Math Growth**

Math growth results remain largely stable across years, with a modest reduction in *Does Not Meet* ratings and slight increases in the *Approaches* and *Exceeds* categories. While the percentage of schools rated *Meets* dipped slightly, overall growth performance continues to reflect that most schools are demonstrating adequate to strong year-to-year student progress.

### **ELA Proficiency**

ELA proficiency improved across the portfolio. FY25 data show fewer schools rated *Does Not Meet* and an increased percentage rated *Meets*. The *Exceeds* category remained consistent, indicating steady high performance among the strongest schools while others improved into grade-level proficiency.

### **ELA Growth**

ELA growth trends reflect a shift in distribution rather than a decline in overall performance. The percentage of schools rated *Does Not Meet* decreased, while more schools fell into the *Approaches* and *Meets* categories. At the same time, fewer schools were rated *Exceeds*, suggesting that some high-growth schools moved closer to expected growth rather than exceptional growth, while overall growth outcomes became more concentrated in the middle performance bands.

### **Literacy Proficiency**

Literacy proficiency remained strong across both years. FY25 shows a reduction in *Does Not Meet* ratings and a stable share of schools rated *Meets* and *Exceeds*. While more schools were rated *Approaches* in FY25, the overall distribution continues to indicate that a large majority of schools are meeting or exceeding literacy expectations.

### **College & Career Readiness**

College and Career Readiness results show increased polarization in FY25. While the percentage of schools rated *Exceeds* increased significantly, the percentage rated *Does Not Meet* also rose, alongside declines in the *Approaches* and *Meets* categories. This suggests growing differentiation among high school programs, with more schools demonstrating exceptional readiness outcomes while others face emerging challenges.
